The project list is coming into clearer focus as the work of gathering bids by the Trustees is nearly complete. The "Parapet Roof" project will need to commence ASAP to address the leaks from the spring weather. The Jamar Company will be completing the work this summer using a newer rubber roof system. This would be an upgrade from what was installed almost 30 years ago! Money has already been given to upgrade the sound system and integrate it into better technology for those (more and more of us) who use hearing aids.

While our official kickoff for the campaign will be in September, we ask for your prayers as we complete our preparations. Please check out the church website for updates!

For over 145 years (over 265 years when combined with the years of ministry of Chester Park UMC), we have been providing not only a beautiful place to worship God and proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ, but also a place for the many and varied outreach ministries of our church. ## Are you ready for some rhubarb?

The rhubarb is up, and the CHUM Rhubarb Festival is counting on FUMC to make LOTS of pies, LOTS of scones, and even rhubarb-chocolate candies!!! We are planning to have LOTS of fun and laughter in the kitchen.

Ways you can help:

- **Help make pies.** Work days are Tuesday, June 9; Thursday, June 11: Tuesday, June 16; Tuesday, June 23; Thursday, June 25; and Friday, June 26; from 9 am 2 pm. Feel free to come and go as it fits your schedule. No previous skill in pie-making is required.
- **Help make scones** (and box pies) on Thursday, June 25 from 1 6 pm.
  - Help make candy on Tuesday, June 23 from 1 5 pm.
- **Bring rhubarb!** Fresh rhubarb (cleaned and chopped if you can) can be left in the church refrigerator for up to a week before any of the work days. Frozen rhubarb can be left in the church freezer any time, although we'd prefer you bring it after June 18. We need LOTS of rhubarb!!

## Sizzlin' Summer Safety Tips

Isn't it wonderful? Summer is here! Grass is green, flowers are blooming, people are out walking, our flowering trees and shrubs are becoming beautiful, many birds have returned to sing their songs, and our lakes are calling us. Yes, God's world is miraculous. We like to enjoy that environment, so let's heed a few safety tips this summer to make our experiences SAFE.

**Sun:** Even if it's cloudy remember to wear sunscreen at least SPF 15. Make sure it says it is Broad Spectrum UVA/UVB. Use it, don't let it just sit in your car or pocket.

**Heat:** If you are planning a trip south where it can actually be HOT remember you are not used to it! It may be that you'll need to acclimate to the heat for a few days before doing any strenuous exercise.

You want to prevent heat exhaustion, so if you plan to exercise in the heat drink at least 16 ounces of water each hour even if you are not thirsty. If you sweat a lot, a sports drink will help you to replace the sodium you lose.

**Helmets:** When using bikes, skateboards, roller blades, or skis, remember to wear your helmet. Adults riding with your children, you need helmets just as much as your kids. Be sure the helmets are the proper size, that they fit level not back of the forehead, and are snugly strapped. Please remember to ride with the traffic, not against it.

**Water:** Boating and swimming are some of our favorite pastimes. If you are an inexperienced boater, take a boat safety class. Completing an online boaters education course approved by the U.S. Coastguard will get you a lifetime boaters education certificate, or a permit if you are 12 to 17 years old.

If you are boating or an inexperienced swimmer, wear a life jacket that fits. Parents should insist that children wear a life jacket any time they are around water. On June 18 Essentia Health will be distributing and fitting life jackets in the Kohl's parking lot from 4 to 5:30p.m.

Did you know that drowning does not look like someone is drowning, with splashing, waving arms, and calling for help? **Drowning can be quiet and undramatic**. Drowning people usually can't call or wave for help. Their mouths alternately sink below the surface and reappear above the surface. They remain in an upright position with no leg kicking and may struggle only 20 to 60 seconds before going under.

Please have a safe summer and let's remember to watch our kids around the water. It only takes seconds for an accident to occur.
