Give your family a gift and begin the process of sharing, with the goal of having documentation of your desires in place. It's time to have those conversations.

Pastor's Pen

Ring out the news — We're alive & well

Earlier this summer I received a letter in the mail that began with the words, *Let your community know your church is alive and well.*

Wouldn't you be intrigued by such a statement? The other night at Ruby's Pantry, one of the people on the Ruby's Pantry board was telling me she had a conversation with a friend who said she had heard that our church was closing. Egad! I assured our Ruby's Pantry board member that we were not closing, though I did say, "Unless the Trustees are just not telling me something." We laughed.

So tell me how I can let the community know our church is alive and well!!

The first sentence of that letter read in full: Let your community know your church is alive and well by ringing bells daily. The letter went on, "Few sounds inspire and invite your congregation and community to worship like the peal of bells or a familiar hymn ringing out – inviting all those who hear to join the worship."

So how large an increase in attendance do you think we would achieve by installing bells that rang out in our community? How long before we had people raising concerns about the noise of the bells? While such a strategy may work in a smaller community, I don't think bells of this kind are really the way we let our community know our church is alive and well.

It is important to let the community know our church is alive and well. We can do that in all kinds of ways. We can continue to open our doors to the community for significant conversations about important issues. We can continue to open our doors for community groups. We can offer quality worship, music (including bells), and educational experiences. We can care for each other well, in all the circumstances of our lives. We can reach out into the community in ways that make a difference in people's lives. We can tell our story, through the media, but also individually. You are the best representatives to let the community know that we are alive and well.

Just as you are the best storytellers to let others know that our church is alive and well, so, too, you are the ones who do the best job
