Rev. David Bard endorsed for bishop

Members of the Minnesota Annual Conference voted unanimously (through a round of applause) in favor of nominating and endorsing Rev. Dr. David Bard for the office of bishop. The nomination will be forwarded to the North Central Jurisdictional Conference, which will take place July 13-16, 2016 in Illinois. Bard was also nominated for bishop in 2008.

Faye Christensen, who was elected last year as a lay delegate to the 2016 General Conference and who submitted the legislation, told members that Bard has "a deep and abiding spiritual foundation and love for God" and "a strong desire to see the church minister to all people with acts of compassion and justice."

Following the vote, Bishop Ough led members in a prayer for Bard and thanked God for his selflessness and deep humility.

Our Future Together

This future is God's mode of being in history. The power of the future isGod's power in time.Jurgen Moltmann, The Coming God, 24

For I am about to create new heavens and a new earth.... Be glad and rejoice forever in what I am creating.... The wolf and the lamb shall feed together; the lion shall eat straw like and ox.

From **Isaiah 65**

As God's people in Jesus, we are a people of hope, a people oriented toward the future. It is not that the past doesn't matter. It does, and it continues to have an impact upon us. It is not that we cannot be fully present in the now. We are encouraged to be.

At the same time, we also trust that the past need not define us entirely. God is a God of new beginnings and fresh starts.

In every present moment, there is also a sense of the pull of the future. We want so to live in the present that the future is more like God's dream for the world. *Sing, sing a new song. Sing of that great day when all will be one. God will reign, and we'll walk with each other, as sisters and brothers united in love. We are called to act with justice. We are called to love tenderly. We are called to serve one another, to walk humbly with God.* ("We Are Called" in *The Faith We Sing*)

I want to say just a few words about the future, mostly to clarify some possible misunderstandings of what I am doing and where I may or may not be going.

By now many of you may have heard that the Minnesota Conference of The United Methodist Church endorsed me as a candidate for bishop, and that this election will occur in 2016. Some have thought that this means I will be leaving in 2016, and some have thought this means I will be leaving in 2016 to become the United Methodist bishop of Minnesota. Neither of these is accurate.

Elections for bishop are held regionally in our denomination, and we are part of what is called the North Central Jurisdiction, which includes the states of Minnesota, North Dakota, South Dakota, Iowa, Wisconsin, Illinois, Michigan, Indiana, and Ohio.

Nine bishops serve in this jurisdiction and three of them will be retiring in 2016. So, in Peoria, IL July 13-16, 2016 there will be an election process to elect three bishops, and after that process is over, bishops will be assigned to their respective areas of service.

All this occurs at what is called Jurisdictional Conference, and I am a voting delegate to that conference. I will also be one of the candidates for bishop. There will be many other candidates, some endorsed by their conferences, some endorsed by other groups within the church. I anticipate that more than a dozen candidates will be part of this election process.

Also note that these projects are not listed in any priority order. We are pleased that the parapet roofing project is underway and the sound system improvements are scheduled.

The Trustees have been and continue to be conscientious in their work as they consider all these projects. The funds needed to complete these projects are within the amount the feasibility study conducted by Val Walker said we could raise in a capital campaign. this path of meeting the deepest needs of our church family and our community, we must take on the responsibility to build on and maintain the tools we use to do so, including our church building.

We are asking you to pray for wisdom, vision, and strength for the upcoming capital campaign. Prayers are needed for the members of the Capital Campaign Steering Committee, the many volunteers who will be assisting with the campaign, the church staff, and the pastoral team. We also ask that you pray for yourselves and for each other as each of us considers the commitment we will make to this capital campaign and to ensuring a bright and vibrant future for our church.

In August a prayer card will be sent out in First Family. The card will be used as a daily reminder to pray for the success of the campaign and as a prayer guide. Also, we are working on a prayer booklet that will be distributed as the campaign begins. The booklet will remind us to continue praying for each other, for our church community, for our world, and for the campaign. It will also remind us that this is not just about needed funds for building upgrades and improvements. This is finally about people, place, purpose and promise for the future. It is about being people who, in this place, are determined to be about the purpose of God now and for years to come.

New sanctuary system to be installed this summer

Some of you may have noticed that a few pews in the back of the sanctuary have been removed. These pews were removed to create space for a new sound booth as well for handicapped seating. The new sound booth is part of a new sound system which will be installed in the sanctuary later on this summer.

The need for a new sound system has been discussed for quite some time. It wasn't long after I started working here as Director of Music three years ago that I started to hear comments and concerns from people who said they couldn't hear well in the sanctuary.

I also became aware that our current sound system had been expanded and changed over a period of time to meet changing music needs. This is not unusual in churches, but the result is somewhat of a piecemeal system. It seemed like it was time to try to address these issues. Funding for the sound system improvements comes from some very generous lead gifts to out upcoming capital campai

So, about two years ago, a Sound Committee was created to discuss our sanctuary's acoustical problems and how we might improve the situation. In the course of our work, we enlisted the help of AVE (Audio Video Electronics), a company that specializes in church sound systems. Funding for the sound system improvements comes from some very generous lead gifts to our upcoming capital campaign that were specifically directed to this project, as well as money raised from the *Make a Joyful Noise* concert held last year.

We have been very impressed with this company and their work.

They put together a proposal for us that includes a current loop hearing aid system and new state-of-the-art speakers that should direct the sound more accurately to the congregation. This proposal was approved by our Trustees last month.

Funding for the sound system improvements comes from some very generous lead gifts to our upcoming capital campaign that were specifically directed to this project, as well as money raised from the *Make a Joyful Noise* concert held last year. We are very thankful for these financial gifts as well as the various people who have helped with this project.

The people on the Sound Committee include Allen Anway, Nick Gosen, Bill Alexander, Mark Harvey, Terry Larson, and me. Ron Yardley is now constructing a new sound booth with the help of volunteers from the church. If you have questions or concerns, feel free to talk to me or someone from our committee. We are excited that this project will greatly improve the sound in our sanctuary.

Let's keep moving this summer

Here are a few ideas to keep moving this summer to maintain your healthy bodies!

Try to have dinners together and go for a pre or post dinner walk. Dance to the music. When my kids were small we had great fun dancing to Chattanooga Choo Choo!

Go on active outings like geocaching, hunting for agates, hiking in one of our great parks, or biking.

Go on a tree hunt.

Take a class together like yoga, karate, or learn about gardening and do it.

Go to the playground and everyone plays.

How about doing a parent and kid swim time? Kids and adults in our area should know how to swim or at the very least tread water and float.

Designate one evening as family fitness night. Each week, a different person designs the family workout that you will all do together, whether it's swimming, rollerblading, walking, Frisbee golf, or whatever.

Purchase a few inexpensive items (jump rope, resistance bands, stability ball, dumb bells) and rotate them through the house on a daily basis. Treat them as scavenger hunt finds-- if you find the jump rope placed in the garage, you have to use it for one minute. Next time you may find it on the porch, or in the basement.

Healthy habits established early help maintain healthy weight through the hormonal changes and social influences of adolescence, and active children are more likely to become fit adults.
