Coming Up in Worship

May 1: Communion Sunday. In the United Methodist Church, the table is open to all. "All who love Christ, earnestly repent of their sin and seek to live in peace with one another are invited to join us in offering our prayer of thanksgiving and receive the body and blood of Christ—regardless of age or church membership."

May 8: Confirmation Sunday. Celebrate the completion of Confirmation Classes with Grant Goodlet, Riley Hinnenkamp, Andrew Hulst, Mullen Johnson, Rebecca Miles, Rowan Racette, Will Smyth, Noelle Stellmaker, and Kiah Walker. Also on that Sunday, the bell choirs will ring a special piece featuring all 32 musicians of our adult, high school, and middle school bell choirs, plus three percussionists.

May 15: Pentecost. MaryAnne Korsch will preach. Celebrated on the fiftieth day after Easter, Pentecost is the day on which the Christian church commemorates the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles and others assembled in Jerusalem. It marks the beginning of the Christian church and the proclamation of its message throughout the world and is often referred to as the birthday of the church. The liturgical color for Pentecost is red, and you are invited to wear red to church that Sunday.

May 22: United Methodist Women Sunday. During worship on May 22 we will celebrate the significant contributions of United Methodist Women to our mission and ministry as a church and as a denomination. Women will take leadership roles in the service.

The sermon will be a father-daughter dialogue between Pastor David and his daughter Elizabeth, who recently spent four weeks in Kosovo, including trips to refugee camps in nearby Macedonia.

Pastor's Pen

General, Annual, Jurisdictional

From May 10-20 in Portland, Oregon, United Methodists from around the world will gather for the quadrennial meeting of The United Methodist Church's General Conference. The General Conference is our denomination's highest decision-making body and is the only body that speaks officially for the denomination.

During those ten days, elected delegates, speaking different languages, will make decisions about the content of our *Book of Discipline* (our church rules and structure) and our *Book of Resolutions* (our church statements on broad issues in society), and will decide denominational priorities for the coming four years. Individuals, local churches, conferences, and church agencies have submitted over 1,100 pages of petitions recommending changes to these documents and suggesting direction for the church. It is ten days of intense work, wonderful worship, and building relationships.

If you would like to learn more about General Conference, or follow some of the proceedings, you can find it on the web at http://www.umc.org/topics/general-conference-2016. There is also a General Conference 2016 app for cell phones.

It is my privilege to be an elected delegate to General Conference for the fifth time, and this time I am head of the Minnesota Conference delegation. I have said that this will be my last time as a General Conference delegate. I have been working, praying, and studying in preparation for this event.

This is a critical time for our denomination. We will be making important decisions about how we will continue together as a worldwide church, including decisions about where future decisions will be made. We have operated for many years with a *Book of Discipline* voted on by all delegates, but whose provisions are only fully implemented in the United States. There is a growing recognition that this may not be serving us well.

Conversations about training for ordination are very different in countries with more developed economies and educational continued next page

systems than in other parts of the world. Conversations about human sexuality are very different in the United States where gay marriage is legal, than in places where homosexuality is criminalized.

Perhaps we need to find some new ways to be a globally connected church. There are some who feel that we have not been strict enough with those who have violated our current denominational rules prohibiting clergy from officiating at same-sex unions or marriages, and they are proposing mandatory suspensions for clergy who engage in such activities. So we will decide if this is a direction we want to go. Please keep me and all of General Conference in your prayers.

Just a reminder, no bishops are elected at General Conference. That happens at regional jurisdictional conferences in July. Our jurisdiction, the North Central Jurisdiction, meets in Peoria, Illinois July 13-16.

As you already know, I have been nominated by the Minnesota Conference to be a candidate for bishop, and if you are interested, a web site supporting my candidacy has been launched:

www.davidabard.org. I am grateful to Doug Buell and others whose pictures are a key part of that web page.

This is a busy time. In the midst of that our work as a church moves on. We will celebrate confirmation this month, always a highlight. We will celebrate United Methodist Women this month. Whatever happens in Portland, we will remain called by God in Jesus Christ to be a church nurturing a thoughtful, passionate, and compassionate Christian faith where within people's lives joy, genuineness, gentleness, generosity, and concern for justice are nourished. God's Spirit continues to move within us and among us. It is a joy to be part of God's work with you.
