Last week my eight-year-old nephew, Lincoln, and I helped with the clean-up for Ruby's Pantry. After we finished breaking down boxes and taking down tables (you are always welcome to come and help with the clean-up ... or anytime in the afternoon), we went outside to put a few things in the dumpster. As we walked around the parking lot we saw a cart on the very far side of the parking lot, so we went to retrieve it. I was commenting on the lack of thoughtfulness of the person who left it, expecting others to clean up after them. To which my nephew said, "The person who didn't bring this cart back might have been old and tired and just couldn't do it. I'm happy to bring it back for them." Then he got the cart and had fun wheeling it back to the church.

We served 900 dinners (450 drive thru and 450 dine in), which is the same as last fall when we broke the record of 900 meals. Our profit is about \$5,000, which is the budgeted amount. This includes the \$1.59 price increase for the 650 lbs of beef ordered—an added expense of \$1,065.50!

We also changed the apple pie to apple crisp. The comments about the crisp were positive.

## The flu and you

Lung diseases are some of the most common medical conditions in the world. Tens of millions of people suffer from lung disease in the U.S. Smoking, infections, and genetics are responsible for most lung diseases.

Since this is the time of year we begin the flu season, as always, make sure you are protecting yourself and others from the flu by practicing good health habits and getting your annual vaccination. Although most people with influenza will recover without additional medical issues, influenza can cause serious illness and death, particularly among older adults, very young children, pregnant women, and those with certain chronic medical conditions.

Children younger than 6 months of age are at higher risk of serious flu complications but are too young to get a flu vaccine. Because of this, safeguarding them from flu is especially important. If you live with or care for an infant younger than 6 months of age, you and others in your family should get a vaccine to help protect them from the flu.

Children between 6 months and 8 years of age may need two doses of flu vaccine to be fully protected from flu. Discuss this with your child's healthcare provider.

**Wash your hands often.** The most common way to catch the flu is to touch your own eyes, nose or mouth with germy hands. **So, keep your hands clean, and away from your face**. Wash hands with soap and warm water for 30 seconds, or about the amount of time it takes you to sing "Happy Birthday" twice.

**Keep it to yourself**. One gift you can give others is to help prevent other people from catching your flu. You should stay home from work, school, and public places when you are sick. (Keep in mind you can still spread germs up **to 7 days after getting sick**). Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your elbow when coughing or sneezing, but never your hand. It may prevent those around you from getting sick.

**WALKERS:** How are you doing? By now the first group of you have been able to measure your steps for one to two weeks and have begun the program. We are having great weather and beautiful colors, so get out there and enjoy! I have found that I walk less than I thought! So keep your goal to add 2,000 steps and enjoy your devotions. Our next group meeting will be Nov. 12 at 11:20 in Fireside. If you would like to begin this program just see me for details!


## End-of-year giving to the Capital Campaign
