Everybody's favorite topic

"Ye ugly, creepin, blastit wonner/Detested, shunn'd by saunt an sinner." —A poem by the Scot, Bobby Burns, in 1786 describing the louse he sees on a prim and proper lady's bonnet in church!

So, you must know that I will share a few things now about head lice since we have begun a new school year. Head lice continues to be one of the most communicable maladies among children, and outbreaks are possible whenever and wherever children gather.

First of all, head lice are not body lice. Head lice need your head to stay alive and they must eat every two hours. A louse can lay 10 eggs a day and it takes 7 to 10 days to be "born" and another 7 to 10 days to lay eggs. Many children do not have a reaction to them like itching. Did you know that the lice cannot live more than 12 hours off a head and they can hold their breath for 2 hours!

Since there is less reporting of head lice in the classroom parents should be checking children's hair. The lice like clean hair as they can grab hold easier.

If your child comes home with lice and nits, you need to remove them by combing with a special metal lice comb. The "terminator comb" is recommended. You need to section the hair and be thorough in combing small sections. Insecticides, especially Lindan should not be used, as this may be very toxic to children. Lice are becoming resistant to pesticide products like these and can cause problems for children. Treatment by combing is very effective and in combination with more natural products yields a good result. Shampoos with mint are a deterrent too as the lice do not like peppermint!

If you can't bring yourself to do this or you can't seem to get rid of the detested little wonners, you can schedule a time at the Lice Lounge and let their personnel do the treatments. In Duluth, the Lice Lounge is located at 113 N 2nd Ave W.

Brushes can be popped into a plastic bag and put in the freezer overnight and the lice will be dead. Bed linens can be washed and dried in a dryer for at least 30 minutes and the lice will be dead. You don't need to clean your whole house, but you do need to check all family members. Pets are excluded as the louse only likes humans.

So don't have a lousy night, have a good night and rid yourself or family members of those detested little creatures.

October 18, 2017 will be the Senior Expo at the DECC from 9am to 3pm. Free tickets are in the church office. Seniors, soon-to-be seniors, or anyone caring for a senior will be able to get information from many vendors, enjoy entertainment, and attend information sessions.

FUMC Scholarships to be awarded in 2017

In the 1950's two young men, John Lennon and Joe Berini, served as First Methodist staff members who worked with Duluth youth, particularly in the Central Hillside area. To commemorate their work, a scholarship fund was developed in 1985.

Subsequent contributions have helped to sustain the Fund and allow for the presentation of 81 scholarships totaling \$73,190. The Lennon-Berini Scholarships for 2017 will be \$1000 each.

The criteria for qualifying as an applicant are:

- Be a member of Duluth's First United Methodist Church;
- Have completed at least two years of college; and
- Be pursuing a people-centered career.

Application forms will be available in the church office as well as on the church's website on November 1, 2017. They will need to be fully completed and turned in by 4 pm on November 24.

Applicants have two options for submitting materials: 1) print all materials and submit in hard-copy form in the office; or, 2) compile all materials (including completed application form, transcripts, recommendations, and candidate statements) into a **single electronic file** and send it to Selection Committee Chair Terry Wallin (teto6@charter.net.).

Incomplete applications will not be considered. The Scholarships will be awarded during the worship service on December 31, 2017.

Why grape juice?

In the history of the church, wine has been the normal drink for Holy Communion. In the 19th century, Methodists and other denominations were persuaded that the unfermented juice of the grape was an important witness to the grace of God and of the church's resistance to the abuses of alcoholic beverage.

This Holy Mystery, the official statement on communion, says, "Roman Catholicism, Eastern Orthodoxy, and many Protestant denominations have always used wine in the Eucharist. During the

movement against beverage alcohol in the late nineteenth century, the predecessor bodies of The United Methodist Church turned to the use of unfermented grape juice. This continues to be the position of the denomination."

The United Methodist Book of
Worship explains, "Although the historic
and ecumenical Christian practice has been
to use wine, the use of unfermented grape
juice by The United Methodist Church and its

predecessors since the late nineteenth century expresses pastoral concern for recovering alcoholics, enables the participation of children and youth, and supports the church's witness of abstinence."
