Loving God in the World

My brother, the Superior, WI chief of police, returned from a medical leave last year and was reviewing various reports that occurred during his absence. He came across the incident below and felt compelled to share it with the community. He redacted the involved person's name for privacy reasons, but the rest is from the incident report. This act of kindness by his officers made him very proud. The incident report follows below....

"On 1/10/2016 at approximately 2149 hrs, I was at Subway on Tower Ave and saw a man come in that I recognized as working at Walmart. The man was shivering and appeared to be very cold. He took his gloves off and was trying to warm up his hands. It was approximately -10 degrees outside. He stood just inside the door for a few minutes and then started to walk out the door. I told Officer Lerette that I felt he was walking to work and was probably just trying to warm up. I suggested we give him a ride to Walmart if he wanted.

"Officer Lerette and I went over and spoke to the man and asked if he wanted a ride. He said he would like a ride and got into my squad. As I drove, I asked him if he had any warmer clothes and where he lived. He told me he didn't have anything else that was warmer and told me he lived near the library. I felt it was unsafe for him to be walking in weather this cold for such a long way.

"I dropped him off at the door at Walmart. He identified himself as XXXXX XXXXXXX. He told me he was done with work at 0700. I asked if he would like a ride home, and he said he would. I told him I would try to arrange a day shift Officer to give him a ride.

"I spoke to the other officers on my shift, and they all put money in so we could purchase some warmer clothes for XXXXXXX. Sgt. Curphy also brought in a winter jacket that he had at home to give to XXXXXXX. I bought a warmer hat, gloves, socks, and face mask for XXXXXXX. All items were given to Officer Babic to give to XXXXXXX when giving him a ride home."
