Earthkeeper: Here I Am, Lord...

After this, I heard the LORD ask, "Is there anyone I can send? Will someone speak for us?" "I'll go," I answered. "Send me!" ~ Isaiah 6:8

Do you feel a call to become an Earthkeeper? The United Methodist Church has a goal to train 500 Earthkeepers. Becoming a commissioned Earthkeeper means you've received a short theological education and learned about real-life examples of what others have done to help the earth, and you will volunteer 10 hours a month for the cause. Earthkeepers are sanctioned with the Global Ministries' Center for Mission Innovation.

Many feel a call to do more for or speak out for the earth. There are numerous ways to do this. You could do it on your own, join any secular conservation and environmental group, join FUMC/Coppertop church's sustainability group, and/or become a commissioned United Methodist Earthkeeper.

As a child my mom's parents gifted me with Ranger Rick magazine. My parents took me fishing, hiking, and camping. One special memory I have is fishing as a preschooler with Grandpa and Grandma Yaeger. This early introduction to caring about nature continued into my adult life and work. I felt the call to do more for God's creation as a journalist writing about a proposed sanitary landfill. Nobody wants a landfill near them, and for a good reason; when I was a girl we called them "dumps." Rules of disposal for unwanted items have changed since then, but the phrase "sanitary landfill" is an oxymoron.

In November 2017 I attended classes at a retreat near Atlanta to become an Earthkeeper. My commissioning took place in downtown Atlanta, at Grace United Methodist Church, which also houses the General Board of Global Missions.

Currently FUMC has two other Commissioned Earthkeepers, Chuck Campbell and Carol Donahue. They received training in Hastings, MN.

Next Earthkeeper Trainings Dates

- Sept. 27-30, 2018 (deadline Sept. 6), Detroit, MI. This training focuses on sustainable community development. Students will meet with leaders at Cass Community Social Services, an agency that provides food, housing, health services, and job programs in green industries.
- Nov. 1-4, 2018 (deadline Oct. 11), Salt Lake City, UT. Attendees will engage in a deeper discussion on climate, disaster, and sustainable development, and visit and serve at UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief) Depot West. www.umcor.org/UMCOR/Relief-Supplies/Relief-Supply-Network
