On the Journey With You

Reflections on Ordination

On June 1, 2013, I sat down with Rev. Pam Serdar at the Amazing Grace Bakery for a conversation about my sense of call to chaplaincy. At the time Pam was serving as the district superintendent in the Big Waters District of the Minnesota Annual Conference, and I was winding down a 33-year career in education. I was just about to retire but had the sense that God was still calling me into something new, and Pam was a good sounding board for helping me to discern what that call might involve. There is something very powerful about speaking one's dream out loud! Coincidentally, it was exactly five years later, on June 1, 2018, that I was ordained by Bishop Bruce Ough as a Deacon in Full Connection in the Minnesota Annual Conference.

Like any new endeavor, the path toward this new dream held its share of exhilaration and despair. There were some "dark nights of the soul" when I wrestled with my long-held theological beliefs, which were challenged by new research or deeper scholarly study. There was the thrill of new learning and connecting with a wide variety of seminary classmates (and, interestingly, I was never the oldest student in my class, which was one of my fears). There most certainly were opportunities to explore various faith practices, interact in new ways with patients and families during my clinical training in hospital chaplaincy, and late nights (or early mornings!) doing the reading and writing required to cement new ideas into practice. It wasn't a seamless journey, and there were times I wondered if I had bitten off more than I could chew. The support from family and friends who journeyed with me was critical, especially during these difficult periods. But throughout it all, God has been faithful and God's call remained constant: You are called to ministry. Keep going.

All of that culminated in a worship service in St. Cloud at our

From Our Parish Nurse

In recent years, skin cancer has been on the rise, and it has become more important for us to protect our bodies from the sun's harmful rays. But how much do you know about sunscreen and sun protection?

Sunscreen Know-how

The sun's rays include ultraviolet A (UVA) and ultraviolet B (UVB) rays. Sunscreen sun protection factor (SPF) measures a lotion's ability to block UVB rays only. To make sure your sunscreen blocks UVA rays as well. look for the words "broad spectrum" on your lotion bottle.

Sunscreens with zinc oxide are recommended because they block both UVA and UVB rays.

Seek shade where available. Keep in mind the sun's rays are usually strongest between 10am and 2pm.

Water and sand both reflect the sun's damaging rays, so use extra caution when at the beach.

An SPF number designates the length of time you can be out in the sun before you get sunburned. For example, an SPF of 30 means you can be out in the sun, without getting burned, 30 times longer than if you had no sunscreen.

For the sunscreen to be effective, you need to use an ounce for exposed areas.

Use sunscreen every day you're outside, year-round. Even on cloudy days, the sun's rays can pierce through with up to 80 percent efficacy.

Typically, an adult should use a water-resistant, broad spectrum, SPF 30 or higher sunscreen and reapply every two hours or so.
