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On the Journey With You

In the book of Revelation, John writes letters to seven churches encouraging the believers to stand firm against the pressures that lie ahead. He encourages them to be faithful in boldly resisting evil. He reminds them that they will be rewarded for standing firm when Christ returns.

One of my favorite verses in this book is Revelation 3:20:

"Here I am! I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in and eat with him/her, and he/she with me."

Powerful, inviting words. This is usually seen as a picture of Jesus knocking on the door of an unbeliever's heart. But remember, this is a letter to the church, a letter to believers. Jesus is knocking at the door of those who already proclaim to be followers... he is urging them to let him into their lives.

Opening the door of our hearts to Christ and inviting him in is about having a relationship with him, allowing his priorities to be our priorities, his vision to become our vision which guides everything we do.

Have we opened the door of our lives to God's Spirit? Have we personally made a decision to follow Christ, or are we "secondhand" Christians?

In his book *Dear Mr. Brown*, Harry Emerson Fosdick writes about secondhand Christians. He puts it like this:

"So many church members are secondhand Christians. Their Christianity is formal, not vital. They have inherited it from their families, borrowed it from their friends, married it, taken it over like the cut of their clothes from the fashion of their group... Their churchmanship is not hypocritically professed. they believe it after a fashion—but the profound experiences of

Mission and Social Justice



United Campus Ministry (UCM) is an outreach to the UMD college community. It is funded entirely through donations, supporting a part-time campus minister and several ongoing programs. Its mission is to guide and support spiritual growth in the academic environment at UMD while valuing our Christian tradition, diversity, peace and justice, community, and interfaith dialogue. It is the single progressive Protestant voice on the campus and a place for students to turn when they simply don't know what to believe!

A working Board made up of representatives from several churches (including Hope and Hillside United Methodist, Peace Church, United Church of Christ, Lakeside Presbyterian, and The Coppertop) support the campus minister through fundraising and assisting with various programs. Karen Buell has been serving as your representative on the Board. With the recent addition of Pastor Jeanine and the new pastor at Hope United Methodist Church, a newly inspired Board is beginning a new school year enthusiastically by hiring Joanne (JoJo) Coffin-Langdon to fill the campus minister role. Due to UCM's financial constraints, she will be contributing only 10 hours a week as compared with the previous 15 hours per week served by Cynthia Coffin-Langdon. Cynthia has been the campus minister for the last seven years, but recently resigned following her appointment as half-time pastor at Hillside United Methodist Church. With her degree in theology, we look forward to the counseling and leadership roles JoJo will provide.

Thanks to the many of you who contribute financially to our drives and make this program possible, we will be able to continue to provide leadership and counseling services and sustain Monday Night Dollar Dinners, exam goodie bags, and other campus ministry activities. Priorities are to reach and disciple as many students as possible, to creatively engage the campus by witnessing to the love of Jesus, to create a spiritual culture where Christian students can thrive and to nurture and equip future leaders for the local church and the world. In fact, two of the

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college students working with our young people this next year at FUMC have come to us through the campus ministry outreach.

Lydia Project

If you were to stop in to FUMC's monthly Prayer Shawl gathering some Wednesday morning, you would notice that most of our stitchers are working on similar projects – long, narrow scarves made of solid purple yarn. This group is participating in the Lydia Project, a one-year initiative across both the Minnesota and Dakotas Annual Conferences in preparation for our General Conference, which will be held in Minneapolis in May of 2020.

General Conference is the official decision-making body of the United Methodist Church. For two weeks every four years, delegates and visitors from all over the world gather to consider legislation together, worship together, and chart the course for the future of our denomination together. The Minneapolis gathering is expected to draw thousands of delegates, dignitaries, and visitors and as the host Annual Conference, we in Minnesota are doing everything in our power to provide a warm and hospitable welcome to these guests. Part of that welcome is providing each delegate, alternate delegate, bishop, and visiting dignitary with a tangible symbol of welcome: a warm, hand-stitched, purple scarf, which serves not only as wonderful souvenir but also as practical solution to overly drafty, air-conditioned spaces in the Minneapolis Convention Center. This initiative has been dubbed the Lydia Project, commemorating Lydia in Acts 16, who was well known for her hospitality and her beautiful purple dyed cloths.

Knitting and crocheting groups across the two conferences have joined in this effort, and the response has been terrific! Our Prayer Shawl team has committed to providing over 200 scarves toward this effort and will be a big part of helping the host committee meet their goal of 5,000 scarves by June of 2019. From Our Parish Nurse

Dementia forums to take place in October

Through the Wilderness of Alzheimer's is the story of a journey into Alzheimer's that Reverend Robert and Anne Simpson share with us. It offers families accurate, firsthand information about the disease, as well as support and practical help for both those who have Alzheimer's and their caregivers. Bob had the disease and Anne was the caregiver. They began their book while living in Grand Marais to "lift the shroud of secrecy and ignorance" and to have people be better equipped to go through the journey.

Alzheimer's can be a very scary thing. Many don't want to talk about it, and many don't know what it is. Often it is the lack of knowledge that increases fear; we don't understand it, we don't know what to say, we don't know what the person afflicted with the disease needs, and we don't know what is needed by the caregivers.

A learning opportunity is coming your way in October on three consecutive Sundays at 11:30am, beginning on the 21st. Gina Diaz and I will hold 60-90-minute sessions on dementia (of which Alzheimer's is one form). We will be using the book as a resource to help us understand one family's blessings and stories as they made the journey.

The first week (**October 21**) will be informative: what is normal aging, what is dementia, what is Alzheimer's, what are the early warning signs, and how to clear up misconceptions.

The second session (**October 28**) will cover living with dementia: the challenges, what people need, and a time for sharing.

The third session (**November 4**) will focus on communication, spiritual needs, a guide to caregiving, and resources.

Come and join us for these sessions in the stage end of Lakeview Social Hall. If you would like to buy the book, I will be placing an order in the latter part of September. If you plan to attend and if you would like a book, there is a sign-up sheet in the Office.

Conversation on "A Way Forward" for the UMC Bishop Bruce Ough

At General Conference 2016 the bishops were instructed to organize a commission to study and make recommendations for a way forward in the UMC in the midst of our differences concerning human sexuality. The commission has finished its work and submitted three possible plans to the Council of Bishops. The Council decided to recommend a specific plan—the One Church Plan (go to this website for more information on this plan: www.minnesotaumc.org/newsdetail/bishops-recommend-one-church-plan-11355712)—to the special session of General Conference, which will meet Feb. 23-26 in St. Louis.

This fall, Bishop Ough will host a series of 15 gatherings across the area to continue the conversations on A Way Forward as the denomination prepares for the special session of General Conference. One of them will be hosted at our church on **Tuesday, September 25**, 6:30-9:00pm.

Members of the Minnesota Conference delegations to the special session of General Conference will assist Bishop Ough in hosting the gatherings. This will provide an opportunity for the delegates to listen to and talk with participants.

Attendees will receive information about the proposals that will go before the delegates to the 2019 General Conference, and the gatherings will also provide a setting in which to share resources and tools for how to facilitate dialogue and build resiliency in local churches.

In preparation for the gatherings, Bishop Ough encourages individuals and congregations to read *Anatomy of Peace* by the Arbinger Institute and *God Unbound* by Elaine A. Heath.
