

# Spiritual Practices for the New Year

funny that has
happened, and thank
God for giving us
humor in our lives.

Loving yourself is the first step in "Love your neighbor as yourself." Spend a few minutes writing about what it means to love yourself. Remember that God loves you. Cultivating our faith life is an important part of wellness. Here are a few ways to gain new perspective of yourself, others and God throughout the year.



Meditation or listening is a part of our faith life that we often neglect. Consider taking five minutes to sit quietly and breathe. Try to quiet your inner voice and just listen.
