

## On the Journey With You

Dear Friends in Christ,

For the past three years, it has been my joy to work in a very part-time capacity at First UMC – the Coppertop—serving in my deacon's secondary appointment as required by our United Methodist Discipline. My role has been primarily to assist in the leadership transition process between Rev. David Bard's departure in 2016, through the interim time of Rev. Rick Fossum's assignment among us, and the arrival of Rev. Jeanine Alexander in 2017.

Now, nearly two years into Pastor Jeanine's tenure with us, it is clear that the time has come for me to renegotiate this secondary appointment and step back from my weekly responsibilities at FUMC. This shift has been in the planning stages for several months, and has been completed in collaboration with Pastor Jeanine and the Staff-Parish Relations Committee. As of July 1, I will no longer be a paid staff member and will fulfill my secondary appointment duties on a volunteer basis. Per the renegotiation agreement with the SPRC, I will continue with some teaching and preaching but on a reduced scale, and I will not keep regular office hours or be in worship leadership each week. This will allow me to be more present in my primary appointment as chaplain at St. Mary's Hospital in Superior while still keeping me well connected at FUMC.

I have an enormous amount of confidence in the leadership of our congregation. Besides Pastor Jeanine, we have very capable lay leaders in Cindy Hedlund and Jim Wheeler, and our skilled Council chairs Chuck Campbell and Scott Hedlund are also deeply committed to the mission of this church. This core leadership team, along with the chairpersons of all of our committees and work teams, demonstrate steadfast commitment to bring hope and healing from the skyline. The expenses increased this spring. The cost of the beef was 23¢ more per pound than last fall. FYI: 641 lbs. of beef (30 roasts) were delivered, compared to 627 lbs. (30 roasts) last fall. The cost of apples went up 5¢ per bushel. The advertising cost increased as well. The total profit was \$4,768.80 for church ministries.

What is priceless is the offering of the warmth and hospitality to the community, the outreach we all experience, and the opportunity to do something important together while we strengthen our relationships.

ensembles, and children's music groups take a break during the summer months, but that doesn't mean that our summer services aren't filled with glorious music! Many individuals share their talents





## From Our Faith Community Nurse

### **June Is National Safety Month**



Injuries are the leading ages 1 to 44. With summer more active and usually have a lot more going on: children

home from school, little ones underfoot, vacations, etc. The good news? Everyone can get involved to help prevent injuries.

Poisonings: Nine out of ten poisonings happen right at home. You can be poisoned by many things, like cleaning products or another person's medicine. Don't share your meds, and make sure they are somewhere inaccessible to children.

Transportation safety: Doing other activities while driving like texting or eating - distracts you and increases your chance of crashing. Almost one in six crashes where someone is injured involves distracted driving.

Please remember water safety: Have properly fitting life jackets and wear them. Young children should have them on at any time they are near the water or on a dock.

Slips, trips, and falls: More than one in four older adults fall each year. Many falls lead to broken bones or head injuries. Do exercises to improve your balance and leg strength. While standing make sure you provide a solid base, i.e. stand with your feet almost shoulder width apart. If you feel dizzy, it could be from a medication you are taking, so find out about side effects and talk to your health care provider. Tai Chi, Yoga, and practicing heel-to-toe walking all help to improve balance.

Slip, Slop, Slap: Avoid those penetrating UV rays. Your skin will thank you as you age. **Slip** on a UV-protective shirt, **slop** on a broad-spectrum sunscreen (at least 30 SPF) and reapply every two hours if in water, **slap** on a hat, and wear sunglasses. Check your skin for any changes. All ethnicities can be affected by UV light and can develop skin cancer. Each year there are more new cases of skin cancer than the combined incidence of cancers of the breast, prostate, lung, and colon.

Remember to stay hydrated. Water is used by your body to help your brain to think, your blood to flow, and your muscles to move. Take water with you every time you are doing physical exercise or relaxing outside in your favorite chair.

Please stay safe and take care of your body this summer!
