





Fall Book Study

Our Fall book study will be a five-week discussion of *The Road Back to You* by Ian Morgan Cron and Suzanne Stabile. This book has the potential to open your eyes to your own personality and help you



zero in on your own unique strengths and weaknesses through the lens of the Enneagram. The Enneagram is an ancient personality type system (similar to the Myers-Briggs Personality Inventory, but with an additional spiritual component) that describes with uncanny accuracy how human beings are wired, both positively and negatively. Knowing about your Enneagram type can be transformational in your relationship with yourself, with others, and with God.

Sign-up sheets will be available in mid-August, and books are available for purchase (suggested donation \$15). Classes will be facilitated by Rev. MaryAnne Korsch and will rely on practical information, relevant illustrations, and discussion.


