Easter Traditional Worship: Sunday, April 9 at 10am in person, livestreamed and on YouTube any time. This service includes an Easter orchestra, bells, choir and organ. The congregation will be invited to join the Sanctuary Choir in singing the Hallelujah Chorus. Coffee, doughnuts and fruit will be available from 9-9:45am.

Easter activities for children! Meet at 9:15 on Easter morning for an Easter egg hunt and playing in the bounce house. There is no Sunday School this morning; kids may remain in worship with their families and fidget bags will be available. Nursery care will be available.
