On Sunday, June 4, we will be hosting the CHUM 50th Anniversary Thanksgiving Service from 3-5pm. On June 4, 1973, 10 congregations, including our congregation, formed an ecumenical coalition known as the Central Hillside United Ministry (CHUM) to minister to the needs of low income and vulnerable people living in their neighborhoods. 50 years to the day, and now with 40 member congregations, the CHUM family consisting of guests, staff, Board of Directors, and supporters, together with invited partners and community representatives, will gather for a Thanksgiving Service marking the faith collaborative's 50 years of service to the Northern Region. A rich interfaith service featuring music, messages, and scripture, with a Proclamation from the Governor of the State of Minnesota will launch a year of observance that will culminate in May of 2024. The offering received will support the work of CHUM. The afternoon's celebration will conclude with an official reception.

They will be going to the Minneapolis area to serve and learn. You can help them get there by purchasing a Mission Trip Share for \$25.
