### Matthew 18:21-35

One: Peter came up to the Lord and asked, "How many times should I forgive someone who does something wrong to me? Is seven times enough?"

All: Jesus answered, "Not just seven times, but seventy-seven times!

One: This story will show you what the kingdom of heaven is like: One day a king decided to call in his officials and ask them to give an account of what they owed him. As he was doing this, one official was brought in who owed him fifty million silver coins. But he didn't have any money to pay what he owed. The king ordered him to be sold, along with his wife and children and all he owned, in order to pay the debt. The official got down on his knees and began begging,

All: 'Have pity on me and I will pay you every cent I owe!'

One: The king felt sorry for him and let him go free. He even told the official that he did not have to pay back the money. As the official was leaving, he happened to meet another official, who owed him a hundred silver coins. So he grabbed the man by the throat. He started choking him and said,

All: 'Pay me what you owe!'

One: The man got down on his knees and began begging,

One: But the first official refused to have pity. Instead, he went and had the other official put in jail until he could pay what he owed.
