Lighting the Seven Lights of Our Lenten Journey

We light seven candles to guide us in our Lenten journey, reminding us that we do not journey in darkness, but have light to guide our way.

- **The light of the CROSS** represents the power and paradox of the Gospel: a way of death becomes the way to life.
- The light of SCRIPTURE lights our way, proclaiming the message of our faith.
- The light of SILENCE reminds us of God's presence in the absence of noise.
- The light of PRAYER guides us as we rise each morning and retire each night.
- The light of the SACRAMENTS of communion and baptism reminds us of God's unconditional love and divine hospitality.
- The light of SACRIFICE is willingly placing ourselves in God's hand as we focus on the ways of Jesus and provide for the needs of others.
- The light of LOVE lights our path showing us the way to go. Love brings light in the midst of darkness. Love ushers in the gift of abundant, eternal life.

Scripture Readings

Philippians 2:1-11

- One: If then there is any encouragement in Christ, any consolation from love, any sharing in the Spirit, any compassion and sympathy, make my joy complete: be of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind.
- All: Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. Let each of you look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others.
- One: Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness.
- All: And being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death even death on a cross.
- One: Therefore God also highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth,
- All: and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God.
