### **Extinguishing of the First Lenten Candle**

One: In the season of Advent, as we prepare for Christmas, we light a new candle each Sunday. In this season of Lent, as we prepare for Good Friday, we extinguish a candle each Sunday to remind us of the approaching darkness of betrayal and death.

All: Jesus came into the world to be the light that guides us to God. During this time of Lenten preparation, we think of those who turned away from the light of Jesus. Jesus healed many who were sick in mind, body, or spirit. Only a few returned to give thanks. We realize that we take the gifts of God for granted...that our lives sometimes lack gratitude. Our lack of gratitude shields the light of Christ from us and others. We extinguish the first candle, confessing our own failure to give thanks to God.

One: Let us sing our Lenten song of prayer as we call upon God's presence.

## James 1: 1-18

One: James, a servant of God and of the Lord Jesus Christ, to the twelve tribes scattered among the nations. Greetings!

All: Consider it pure joy, my friends, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith develops perseverance. Perseverance must finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything.

One: If any of you lacks wisdom, ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given.

All: But when you ask, you must believe and not doubt, because the one who doubts is like a wave of the sea, blown and tossed by the wind. That one should not think they will receive anything from the Lord; they are a double-minded person, unstable in all they do.

One: The person in humble circumstances ought to take pride in their high position. But the one who is rich should take pride in their low position, because they will pass away like a wildflower. For the

sun rises with scorching heat and withers the plant; its blossom falls and its beauty is destroyed. In the same way, the rich person will fade away even while they go about their business.

All: Blessed is the person who perseveres under trial, because when they have stood the test, they will receive the crown of life that God has promised to those who love God.

One: When tempted, no one should say, "God is tempting me." For God cannot be tempted by evil, nor does God tempt anyone; but each one is tempted when, by their own evil desire, they are dragged away and enticed. Then, after desire has conceived, it gives birth to sin; and sin, when it is full grown, gives birth to death. Don't be deceived, my good friends.

All: Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Lord of the heavenly lights, who does not change like shifting shadows. God chose to give us birth through the word of truth, that we might be a kind of first fruits of all that was created.
