Lighting the Fourth Advent Candle – the Candle of Peace

Leader: We begin our last Sunday of the season of Advent by relighting the candles of Hope,

Love, and Joy.

Psalm 98, upon which the hymn *Joy to the World* is based, names the joyful expression of all creation as the response to the news that the Prince of PEACE, Emmanuel, is coming at long last. Love, not chaos, will reign and balance will be restored. As we get ever closer to Christmas, we acknowledge with hymn writer Isaac Watts that "God rules the world" – not with sword or domination, but "with truth and grace." In this, all nations, all of the world will prove God's presence in and through this peaceful joy.

Today is the fourth Sunday of Advent, the Sunday of PEACE. Let us join our voices with heaven and earth, proclaiming along with the Psalmist:

All: Sing a new song to the Lord. Lift your hearts with gratitude and joy, Peaceful Joy! Your steadfast love and faithfulness are ever present in our lives.

Leader: We light this fourth candle today to remind us that Jesus Christ is our peace. Because

of Jesus, we have PEACEFUL Joy!
